The Family is Built on Commitment

| • | 25 percent of those born 1997-2013 are likely not going to get married. The share of adults who are married has been steadily declining for decades. In 2013, just half of Americans were married, down from 57% in 2000. In 1960, 72% of U.S. adults were married. In 2013, four-in-ten new marriages included at least one partner who had been married before, and two-in-ten new marriages were between people who had both previously walked down the aisle. The divorce rate is double what it was in 1960 In 1970 89% of all births were to a married couple. Today only 60% are. Nearly 50% of all people live together before they get married. In 1960 virtually no one did. |

Consider the benefits of Marriage

- Children raised in intact families have, on average, higher academic achievement, better emotional health, and fewer behavioral problems.
- Fathers of intact families spend, on average, more time with their children.
- Teens who frequently have dinner with their families are at a lower risk of substance abuse.
- Adolescents from intact families are less likely to become sexually active.
- Children raised in intact families by happily married parents tend to be more religious in adulthood.
- Children raised in intact families are more likely to have stable and healthy romantic relationships as adults.
- Intact families are more likely to provide a safe home for children.
- Married mothers tend to create a better home environment for their infants.
- Married mothers are less likely to experience abuse and violence.
- Married fathers tend to have better psychological well being.
