When these disciples heard that the Christ had already come, they were baptized in the name of the Lord After they were baptized, Paul laid hands on them and the Holy Spirit came upon them causing them to speak in tongues and prophecy. Paul went into the Synagogue teaching the ______ about the kingdom of God. When the Jews did not believe, Paul started sharing the message with the ______ as well. He spent two more years in Ephesus teaching at the school of Tyrannus which resulted in both Jews and Greeks being baptized into Christ. These unusual miracles became known to ______ the Jews and Greeks that lived in Ephesus. Those who believed, confessed their sins and some burned their books of magic in the sight of **all** the people. The word of the Lord grew mightily and ______ in Ephesus. Acts 17:5-9 In Thessalonica, Paul and his companions were accused of turning the world upside down. This reputation Paul had, combined with the success he had in convincing those who practiced magic to burn their books, gave Alexander and the rest of the craftsmen great concern. This led to the riot we talked about in our second point. Acts 20:17-38 Paul reminded the Ephesian elders of his selfless work in their city amid ______ persecution. He told them that he was innocent of the blood of all men since he told both Jews and Greeks the _____ counsel of God. He emphasizes the incredible ______ they had as overseers of God's flock in Ephesus. He warned them that _____ wolfs would enter the flock and try and tear it apart.
